**Our New Testament Study continues this Sunday Evening**

In the first session we explored the identity of Jesus as God's story moved from the Old Testament into the New Testament:

*At the heart of this study is Jesus. The coming of Jesus – his life, actions, missions, death, and resurrection—was the fundamental element for all writers of the New Testament. In the New Testament, God's mission becomes embodied in the person of Jesus the Galilean. The New Testament writers wrestled with the Hebrew Scriptures in order to interpret the importance of God's mission in the world and the role of the people in it.<sup>1</sup>*

This Sunday night we'll take a closer look at the transformation we are called to using the lens of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount:

*The sermon lays out examples of what it means to be part of God's kingdom through the direction of Jesus and establishes guidelines on how to develop and maintain relationships in the new realm of God. The teachings involve other persons, those inside and outside the community of faith.<sup>2</sup>*

**Join us in the fellowship hall at 6pm Sunday evening** as we continue this journey through the Good News. Books are still available for \$10, and participants are encouraged to read the short daily assignments in preparation for listening and discussion.
